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Export inspections for last week were fair for wheat but poor for other grains and sovbeans especially year to date figures. Lower soybean meal prices added weakness to bean bids.

Grains inspected for export for week ended 12/28/00: Wheat totaled 21.0, up 6.2 million bushels, corn 15.1, down 25.3, sorghum 1.0, down 3.8, and soybeans 18.9, up 500 thousand bushels compared to a week ago.


