an "Agriculture Attache Tour." to help build international trade relations with Lancaster County's Agribusiness Community. The Lancaster County Chamber of Commerce Agriculture Committee also has developed a Lancaster Farming Facts handout to help promote Lancaster County Agriculture.

The Franklin County Farm-City Council contacted thousands of people through their agriculture promotion efforts. Fourteen activities were spon-

sored by the Farm-City Council, ranging from hosting a Business Expo featuring all aspects of industry in Franklin County and "Agricultural Weekend" at a



with no preservatives or additives. The flavor of the wine is from the fruit itself. "Pennsylvania grows the best fruit for wine making," said Mary Sorrenti. "I have tried fruits from other locations, but Pennsylvania has the deepest colored and most fragrant fruit."

The next day in his opening remarks at the Farm Show, Lt. Gov. Schweiker, said the six-day farm show showed the future of our \$44 billion agriculture that includes 800,000 employees. "I'm privileged to be in your


company," he said.
