Trucklot buying interest remained light and selective and was generally noted as typical of midweek trading. Offerings of bone-in breasts were well balanced, however, boneless-skinless breasts were readily available. Dark meat items were more than sufficient. Wings continued to see active interest and were no more than adequate to tight, although, sellers were finding some resistance at the higher premiums. Movement into retail and distributive channels was slow. The market tone was steady to fully steady on bone-in breasts, no better than steady on boneless-skinless breasts, about steady on the balance.

Wheat bids were higher after good overnight export sales from Taiwan. Corn bids slightly higher due to profit taking ahead of USDA's production report due tomorrow. Soybeans closed lower as continued good conditions in Argentina's soybean belt.
