**Report Supplied By USDA**

Compared to three weeks ago: Feeder steers 2.00-4.00 lower; feeder heifers 1.00-3.00 lower. Exception noted on few heavy weight feeders that will finish feeding for the strong April market. Demand moderate for feeders. Stockers and calves under 600 lbs 1.00-3.00 higher with good demand. Quality average. Feeder cattle in medium to mostly fleshy conditions. This seasons wheat pasture scarce due to late fall rains followed by unusually frigid temps leaving farmers no choice but to bunk feed cattle. Stockers and calves in thin to moderate flesh conditions. Weigh-ups average. Slaughter cows 1.00-2.00 lower. Packer demand moderate at best for cows. Packers drawing on their feedlot programs of stockpiled cows from the fall culling period thus less aggressive than number of available cows would

suggest. Slaughter bulls 2.00 higher. Total of 370 cows and bulls sold with 50 percent to packers. Receipts this week 12,558; last week no sales; last year 17,414.

Supply consisted of 69 percent yearlings over 600 lbs; 28 percent calves and light yearlings under 600 lbs. 3 percent cows and bulls.

Heifers comprised 36 percent of feeder and calf supply.

Prices follow with weighted average weight and price in parenthesis.

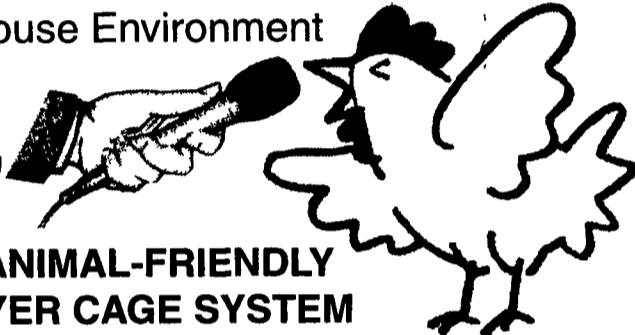

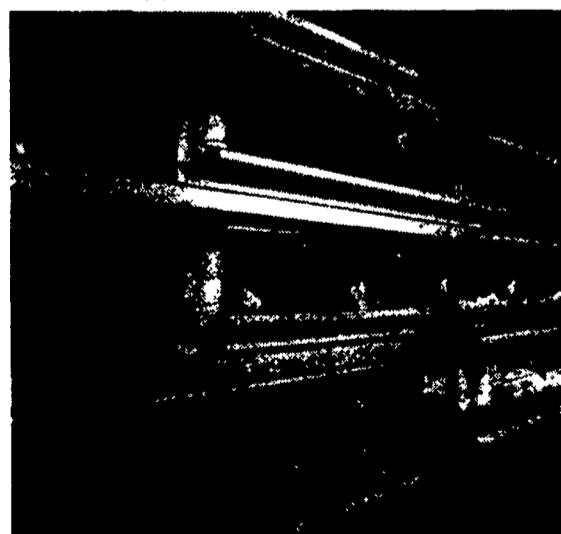
