Be Ready For Whatever Old Man Winter Dishes Up

NEWARK, Del. — Severe winter storms can keep you from doing your regular food shopping, or knock out gas or electric power, making it difficult to prepare meals at home.

But you can be ready for anything Old Man Winter dishes up with a little advance planning and an "emergency pantry" of canned and packaged goods, said Maria Pippidis, family and consumer sciences educator for University of Delaware Cooperative Extension.

According to Pippidis, stockpiling nutritious foods for use during weather emergencies is easy and a real help when you can't prepare meals as usual. Here are her tips for combining good nutrition with easy preparation:

- Buy foods that have an extended shelf life; check use-by dates.
- Date containers at the time of purchase and rotate emergency foods into the regular food supply to prevent them getting beyond their use-by date.
- To ensure protein intake,

include canned tuna, chicken, Vienna sausages, spaghetti with meat sauce, baked beans, peanut butter and evaporated milk. Also, soy protein mixes (you just add water and stir) are good sources of protein.

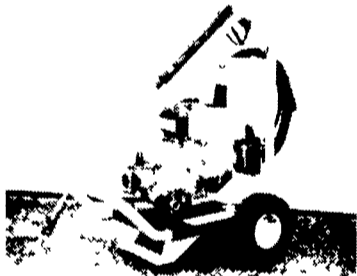
• For fiber and carbohydrates, stock up on canned fruits and applesauce, vegetables, stewed tomatoes, securely packaged whole-grain crackers and cereals, canned or packaged soups and potatoes.

• Beverages should include bottled water, instant milk or shelf milk and canned, ready-to-use juices.

• Add some bottled catsup, mustard, mayonnaise, relish and canned seasonings.

"Don't forget to add a hand-operated can opener and non-perishables such as paper plates and cups and plastic forks and spoons, toilet paper, and paper towels," Pippidis advised. "For outages, keep batteries, a flashlight, matches and candles handy, and your emergency pantry will be complete."

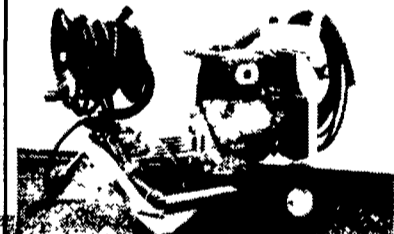
