Demand moderate for most classes. Very good demand for grazing steers as buyers begin accumulating numbers for the spring grass season. Quality average to attractive with several attractive calves Feeder cattle in medium to fleshy conditions with excess flesh still attributed to feed rather than wheat. Calves in moderate to fleshy conditions, few slightly thin. Weigh-ups gaunt to average, few full. Slaughter cows 1.00-2.00 higher. Slaughter bulls steady. Packer demand good for light run of cows. Total of 270 cows and bulls sold with 45 percent to packers. Receipts this week 12,600; last week 12,558; last year 15,662.


