Daily National Grain Market Summary Wheat bids finished mixed, 1 to 3 cents lower to 2 cents higher. Corn bids 1 to 2 cents higher. Sorghum 4 cents higher. Soybeans 1 to 4 cents higher.

Slight declines were seen in the wheat pits, Wednesday, as beneficial snows is projected for parts of the Hard Red Winter areas. Corn bids were slightly higher with reports of a reduction in U.S. corn planted acres this spring but indications of StarLink corn founded in shipments to Japan limited gains. Soybean bids rebounded after yesterday's sharp

advances. Fund buying in soybean market also added support to bean bids.
