Grain bids moved slightly higher with soybean bids mixed. Export optimism and carryover strength from yesterday. Wheat bids 1 to 3 cents higher. Corn steady to 2 cents higher. Sorghum steady. Soybeans bids mixed, 1 cent lower to 2 cents higher.

More export sales overnight gave some support to wheat bids. Continued crop concerns in parts of HRW wheat growing areas due to freeze damage

added support. Corn bids were supported by ideas export business is picking up. Indications are that South Korea and Taiwan are in the market for corn. Soybean bids finished mix on reports of improve export interest from Indonesia but gains are being limited by upcoming Brazilian harvest.


