Milk Marketing Board Announces January Class I Price

HARRISBURG (Dauphin Co.) — The Milk Marketing Board (MMB) announced the prices to be paid to Pennsylvania dairy farmers for January Class I milk (beverage) as an average of \$18.04 in the western areas of the commonwealth, and an average of 18.53 in the central and eastern areas of the commonwealth.

However, the price received by an individual dairy farmer will vary as the component composition of a farm's milk differs from the established benchmarks of 3.5 percent butterfat, 2.99 percent protein, and 5.69 percent other solids.

These prices do include the current over-order premium of \$1.40 per one hundred pounds of milk, and the fuel adjustment premium of \$.25 per one hundred pounds of milk.

Since 1988, the MMB has mandated over-order premiums on Class I milk due to adverse conditions affecting the Pennsylvania dairy farmer.

Chairwoman Beverly R. Minor announced that since the inception of the MMB's overorder premium in 1988, Pennsylvania dairy farmer have received \$222,752,000 in additional income.
