Daily National Grain Market Summary

Wheat bids moderately higher with corn and soybean bids lower. Traders spent most of the day making last minute position adjustments before USDA's supply and demand report Thursday. Wheat bids steady to 5 cents higher. Corn bids 1 to 2 cents lower. Sorghum 3 cents lower. Soybean steady to 3 cents lower. Not much activity in the pits to sway bids in either direction. Wheat bids higher as slow export demand and short covering was noted in wheat market ahead of USDA's report. Corn slightly lower on predictions of a cut in export projections but losses are limit as cheaper corn prices continue to spark export interest. Soybeans bids also lower as position squaring the main factor and soybean meal is higher.


