

Daily National Grain Market Summary

Grain and soybean bids moderately higher as concerns of winter wheat crop and continued good export interest supported bids. Wheat bids 1 to 3 cents higher. Corn 3 to 5 cents higher. Sorghum 9 cents higher. Soybeans 2 cents higher.

Wheat bids higher with St. Louis up much as 7 cents. Crop concerns continue in winter wheat growing areas with reports of insurance companies expanding staff to handle widespread losses supported bids. Corn bids higher with good weekly export sales and a cut in South African corn production numbers may cause favorable export business. Soybean bids also higher with talks that USDA has under-reported export inspections in the past two weeks and improve export interest continued to be a positive factor.

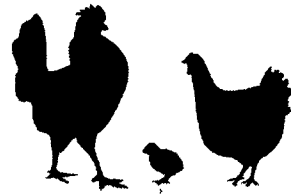

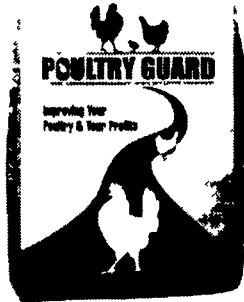
