The Pennsylvania Cattlemen's Association has announced it will present two additional scholarships this year to young perin the cattle industry.

Applications must be postmarked on or before March 10, 2001.

Winners will be awarded scholarships at the annual Pennsylvania Cattlemen's Association Banquet on Thurs., March 29 before the Pennsylvania Beef Expo in State College.

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
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
