Less than trucklot asking prices were 1 cent higher at 57 to 71 cents. Trade sentiment was fully steady. In the parts complex, breast items, mainly boneless skinless were noted as available. 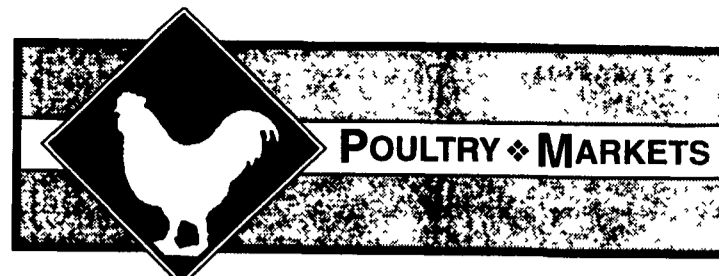

Prices were unchanged to higher on whole and whites and ranged unchanged to lower on sugar and salt yolks when compared to a week earlier. Trading was only fair and mostly on small lots. Supplies were sufficient but generally not offered at discounts as raw cost trends higher. However, the undertone was somewhat mixed as traders watch further market developments. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending February 10, 2001 were 3 % less than last week, and 12 % less than a year ago.

In Philadelphia prices were unchanged to 2 cents lower on medium. In New England, prices were 5 cents lower on jumbo. Elsewhere prices were unchanged. The market tone was mixed on brown eggs. On white eggs, the market tone was steady on heavier weights and barely steady to weak on balance. Supplies were adequate to ample. Demand was light. The New England shell egg inventory was 35 percent more than the previous week. The Pennsylvania inventory was 15 percent less and the Delaware/Maryland inventory was 22 percent more than last Monday. Breaking stock demand was fair for generally adequate offerings. Light type hens were usually sufficient for normal to less than normal processing schedules.
