

In Philadelphia prices were unchanged to 2 cents lower on medium. In New England, prices were 5 cents lower on jumbo. Elsewhere prices were unchanged. The market tone was mixed on brown eggs. On white eggs, the market tone was steady on heavier weights and barely steady to weak on balance. Supplies were adequate to ample. Demand was light. The New England shell egg inventory was 35 percent more than the previous week. The Pennsylvania inventory was 15 percent less and the Deleware/Maryland inventory was 22 percent more than last Monday. Breaking stock demand was fair for generally adequate offerings. Light type hens were usually sufficient for normal to less than normal processing schedules.


