In the Southeast, prices were lower on all sizes. In Chicago, prices were lower on smaller sizes and unchanged on the balance. In all other locations, prices were unchanged. The market tone was about steady to steady in the Northeast. Elsewhere, the trade sentiment ranged steady to weak, mostly barely steady. Demand continued light to moderate and was slightly better where featured. Supplies were generally adequate in all areas except California, which was in close balance. Breaking stock supplies were at least adequate to fully adequate for the light demand. Light type fowl were sufficient for processing requirements.

Grain and Soybean bids moderately higher as the Census crush report showed strong soybean use in the month of January and traders were able to put first notice day liquidation behind them. Ignited bids. Wheat bids 2 to 7 cents higher. Corn 2 to 5 cents higher. Sorghum 7 cents higher. Soybean bids 2 to 3 cents higher.

Wheat bids sharply higher as the end of long liquidation support bids and winter wheat conditions in the Southern Plains reported little improvement. Corn bids higher after carryover strength of surging soybean and wheat bids. Soy-

bean bids slightly higher as crush reports of stronger than expected demand for the soybean products. There rumor of minor soybean steers in areas of Argentina have been mostly dry and rains in Brazil pushing too far south. 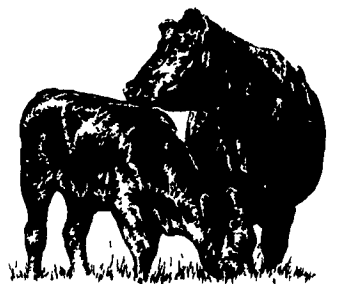
