## READING THE EMBERS

The first set of this year's twelve Ember Days, said to indicate the weather for the coming year, occur on March 7, 9, and 10-the first Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday following the first Sunday in Lent. The weather on Wednesday represents that of April, Friday's weather prognosticates that for May, and Saturday's weather will tell us about June. Historically, four sets of

these Ember Days were set aside in the Roman Catholic and Anglican churches for fasting, prayer and the ordination of clergy. Other Ember Days this year will be the Wednesdays,

Fridays and Saturdays that follow Whitsunday (or Pentecost) on June 3; Holy Cross, always September 14; and the Feast of St. Lucy on December 13.

As it rains in March, so it rains in June.


