Trucklot buying activity was mostly fair to moderate as dealers cautiously assessed the market, however, occasional pick-up was noted where delivery delays were now being covered. Offerings of boneless-skinless breasts were at least adequate, and bone-in breasts were available and often at discounted levels. Drums and thighs were about adequate, and wings continued to clear well. Movement through retail channels was mostly fair, with best interest noted into refill. Renewed demand through restaurant lines had yet to surface. The market tone was barely steady to instances weak on bone-in breasts, fully steady on wings, about steady on the balance.

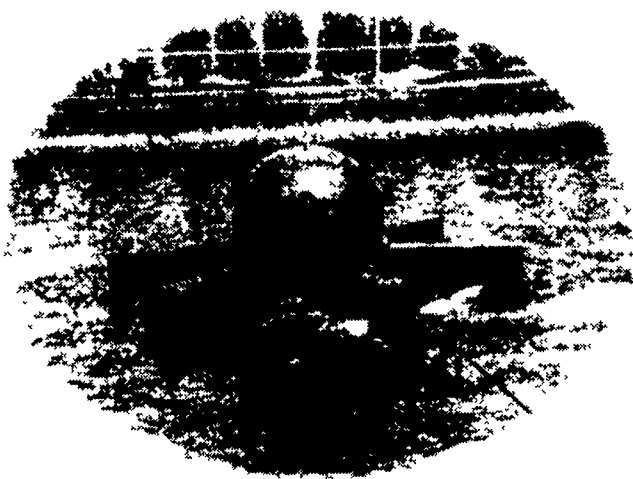
