Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was limited to standing commitments in most cases. Seller offerings varied from well balanced to ample on the 2.25 and 2.5 pound sizes. Heavier weights were in excess and were competitively priced in an effort to stimulate additional buying interest. Live supplies were about moderate; weights were light to heavy, mostly desirable to heavy. Processing schedules were moderate. Less than trucklot asking prices were 1 cent lower at 55 to 69 cents. Trade sentiment remained weak and unsettled. In the parts complex, all items were at least adequate for the very light and cautious buying interest.
