Trucklot buying activity was mostly light as purchasing activity continued to center around regular commitments and dealers found that any extra product on hand was generally difficult to place. Offerings of boneless-skinless breasts were more than sufficient, and bone-in breasts remained readily available with discounting often noted. Dark meat parts were at least adequate, although, leg quarters were usually the best balanced item. Wings remained well cleared. Movement through retail and distributive channels very limited, however, spot feature activity was spurring additional interest in some areas. The market tone was no better than steady on boneless skinless breasts, barely steady on bone-in breasts, about steady on the balance.

Mostly prices were lower on blends, unchanged on whole and whites, and unchanged to higher on yolks when compared to a week earlier. Trading was fair but buyers were still unaggressive. Supplies were tighten on yolks, other items were sufficient for trade needs. The undertone was fully steady to firm on yolks, generally steady on whole, but mixed and unsettled on whites. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending March 03, 2001 were 7 % less than last week, and 14 % less than a year ago.

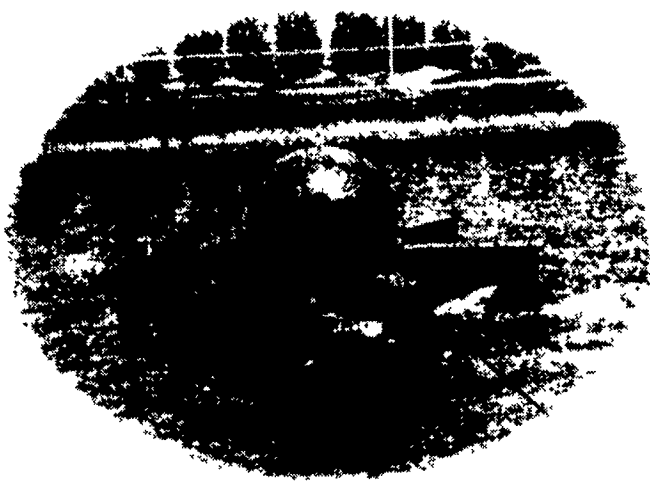

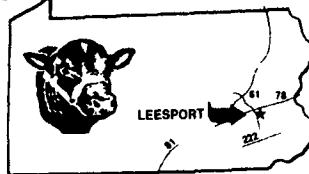
