The undertone was firm on yolks, fully steady to firm on blends, steady on whole, and unsettled on whites. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending March 10, 2001 were 4% more than last week, but 13% less than a year ago.
