Report Supplied By USDA Prices were sharply higher on yolks and blends, unchanged to slightly higher on whole, and unchanged on whites were compared to a week earlier. Trading was irregular. Offerings were held with confidence on yolks, other items were usually sufficient for trade needs. The undertone was firm on yolks, and blends, steady on whole, and unsettled on whites. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending March 17, 2001 were unchanged from the previous week, but 4 % less than a year ago.
