Declines were seen in grain and soybean bids, today. Concerns about weather and its impact on crop development pressure bids. Bids was lower for all commodities, Wheat 3 to 5 cents lower, Corn bids 2 to 4 cents lower, Sorghum 4 cents lower, and Soybeans 3 to 6 cents lower.

Trade was slow as traders await USDA's Prospective Planting report. Wheat bids lower with wet weather in the U.S. Corn and Wheat belts, continue to keep plant development behind normal. Corn prices was lower as lack of export interest and pre-report positioning drove bids lower. Soybeans also lower due to poor overnight trade and favorable harvest weather in South America. Also, the U.S. dollar traded higher on the day, giving reason for a slightly lower market.
