Prices were sharply higher on yolks, unchanged to higher on blends, unchanged to slightly higher on whole, and unchanged on whites when compared to a week earlier. Trading was light and very irregular. Offerings continue to be held with confidence on yolks, other items were usually sufficient for trade needs. The undertone remained firm on yolks, unsettled on whites, and usually steady whole. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending March 24, 2001 were 1 % more than the the previous week, and 3 % more than a year ago.
