Leg quarters continued to clear well, and tenderloins had become more closely balanced. Wings were usually sufficient. Movement into retail and distributive channels was limited as holiday items began to make their way into the market. The market tone was fully steady to instances firm on leg quarters and tenderloins, about steady on the balance.
