Both grain and soybean bids closed slightly higher. Trade is supported due to favorable planting weather and the possibility for corn acres moving to soybeans this year. Bids were higher for Wheat 1 to 7 cents, Corn 2 to 4 cents higher, Sorghum 6 cents higher, and Soybeans bids was 5 to 7 cents higher.

Wheat bids were higher with moderate export business, but is still quite limited. Crop conditions remain encouraging and the lower value of the dollar may offer addition tenders for export. Corn bids mostly higher, as weather conditions slowly taking influence on fieldwork duties. Slight advances in soybean prices, as a wet spring favoring more soybeans acreage.

However, upcoming Brazilian harvest limiting upturns.
