Offerings of yolks continue to be held with confidence, whole egg were slightly improved and whites were reported as showing increased availability. The undertone was fully steady to firm on yolks, steady on whole, and unsettled on whites. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending March 31, 2001 were 1% less than the previous week, and 3% less than a year ago

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds increased slightly where buyers looked to insure an adequate supply through the Holiday period as most plants planned to close on Friday or Monday. Offerings were fully sufficient. Live supplies were moderate to light; weights varied and were mostly desirable to heavy. Processing schedules were moderate to light. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 51 to 65 cents. Trade sentiment was mostly steady. All parts were adequate. Wings generally cleared well. Most leg items were in good balance. Bone-in and particularly boneless skinless breasts were fully adequate to ample.
