### **Farmers Union Urges Reform Of Estate Tax**

WASHINGTON, D.C. -National Farmers Union has urged congressional leaders to adopt responsible estate tax reform that provides immediate help to families, farmers and small business owners.

"Congress has a real opportunity to address meaningful tax reform that helps our hard working family farmers and ranchers and small business owners with relief immediately, rather than waiting for possible repeal down the road that may still subject their heirs to capital gains tax. The other proposals also provide a windfall to America's wealthiest families, jeopardizing our ability to address other national priority issues such as education, health care and the rural economy," said NFU President Leland Swenson.

Farmers Union urges Congress to adopt an estate tax reform package that immediate-

- Increases the exemption to a minimum \$4 million of net estate value per individual (\$8 million per couple, indexed for future inflation).
- Retains stepped-up basis.
- Simplifies the exemption qualification rules.
- Modestly reduces current rates on the non-exempt portion of estates.
- · Expands the current annual gift allowance to \$25,000.

"Our plan will maintain fiscal responsibility and ensure the availability of resources necessary to address our many national priorities. We urge Congress to accomplish this goal," said Swenson.

- Recognize dairy food processing and distribution business-


es that maintain and invest in a long-term commitment to the Pennsylvania dairy food indus-


