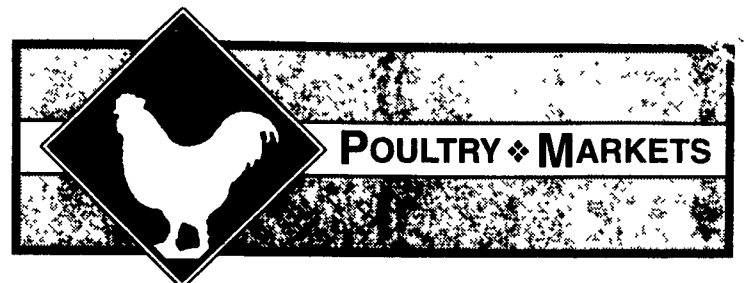

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was about moderate with the bulk of activity relegated to standing commitments. Offerings continued to vary from plant to plant by both size and volume, but remained fully sufficient for current inquiry. Live supplies were mostly moderate; weights were irregularly light to heavy. Processing schedules were moderate to moderately heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 53 to 67 cents. Trade sentiment was mostly steady. Wings were firm and wanted. Leg items were clearing satisfactorily. Bone-in breasts were in a closer better balanced position; boneless skinless remained ample.
