Trucklot buying activity ranged fair to moderate as dealers continued with a cautious and selective posture. Offerings of boneless-skinless breasts remained available, however, bone-in breasts were usually balanced to adequate. Active interest centering around wings kept product no more than adequate to occasionally tight. Dark meat cuts were usually sufficient, but clearing satisfactorily. Retail and distributive draw was only fair as purchasing was generally limited to normal commitments. The market tone was firm on wings, fully steady on dark meat items, steady on bone-in breasts, and no better than steady on boneless-skinless breasts.

Prices were higher on yolks, unchanged to lower on whole, and slightly lower on whites when compared to a week earlier. Trading was light to fair. Offerings of yolks were short and held with confidence, supplies of whole egg

were usually adequate, and whites were reported as fully sufficient for a lack luster demand. The undertone was fully steady on yolks, about steady on whole, and unsettled to barely steady on whites. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending April 07, 2001 were 1% more than the previous week, but 4% less than a year ago.
