Ever have a burning desire to know what a petticoat is and what it was used for? Or why people dressed the way they did in Colonial America?

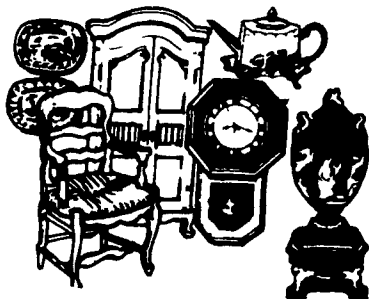
If you answered "yes" to any

theorems that have animals, birds, and butterflies in addition to the traditional basket of fruit. Pass up examples with rips, yellowing or stains. Theorems were also used in mourning paintings.

It is possible to date a theorem by the style of the bowl or basket holding floral or fruit arrangements. For instance, pressed glass compotes weren't made before the 1830s.

The 1976 Bicentennial revived interest in making and collecting theorems. Many contemporary painters of theorems on velvet can command top dollar. Best known are David Ellinger and William Rank, both from Pennsylvania.

Unfortunately, there are also fakes being passed off as old. Study museum examples, if possible, before investing too much money.

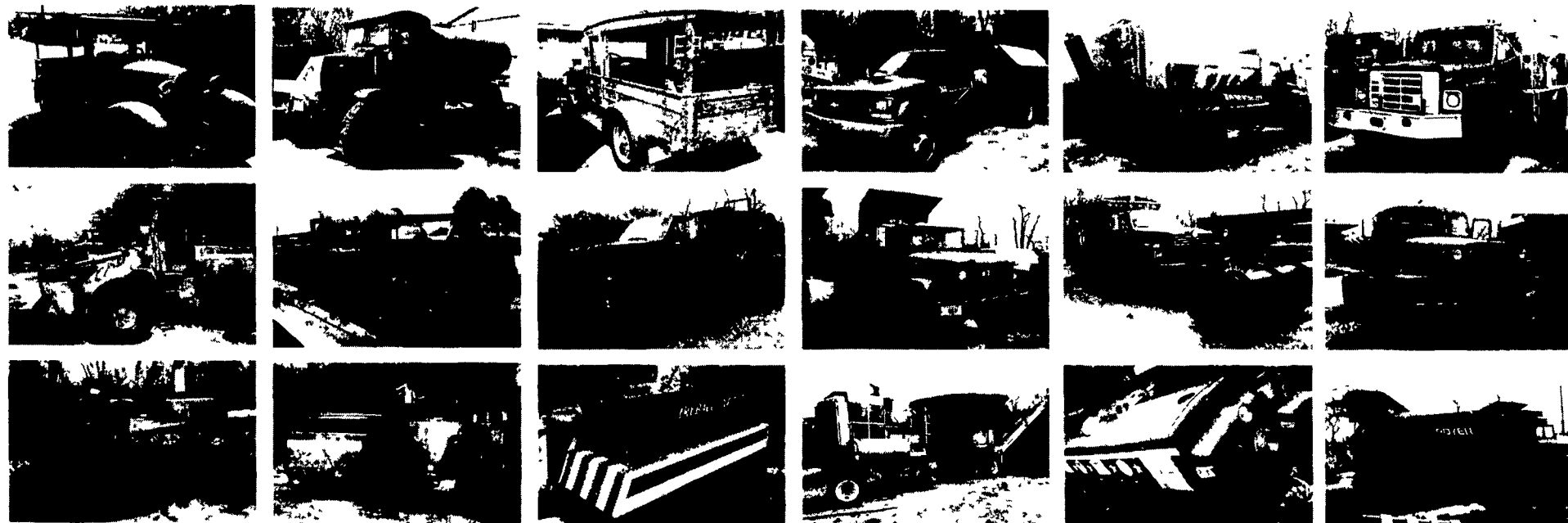
