

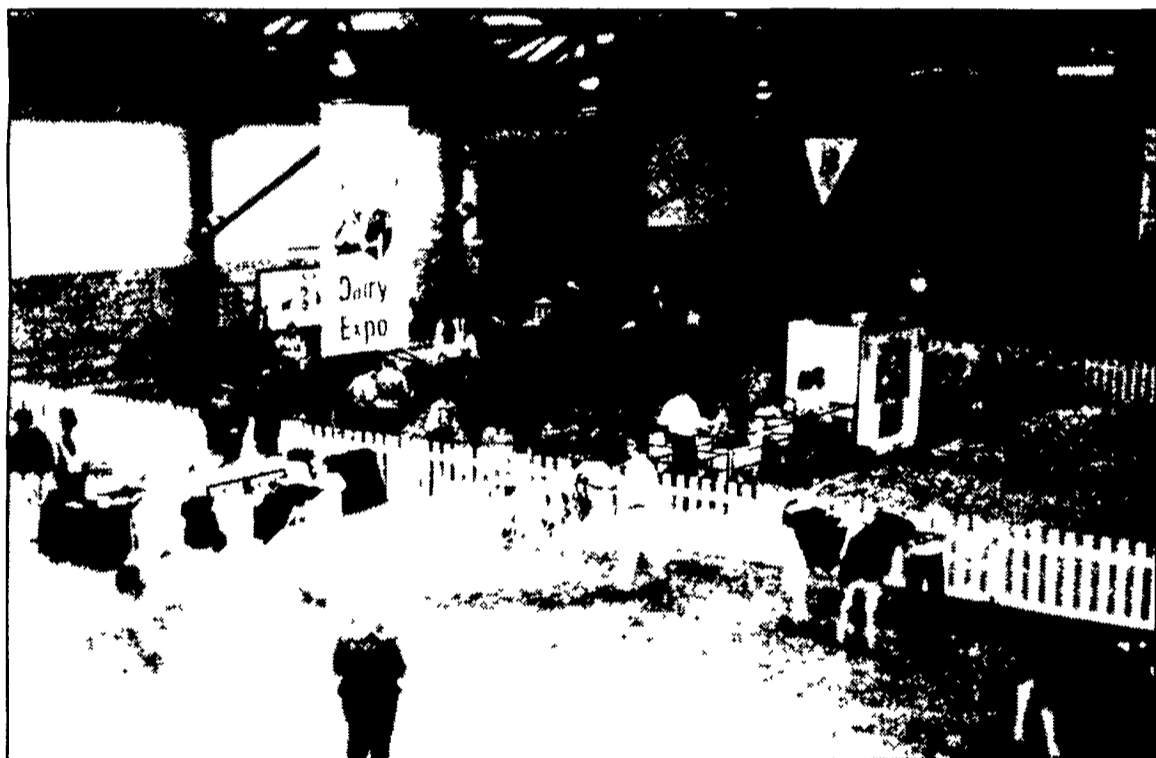
Photos Take Stock Of Dairy Expo, Little International Activities
