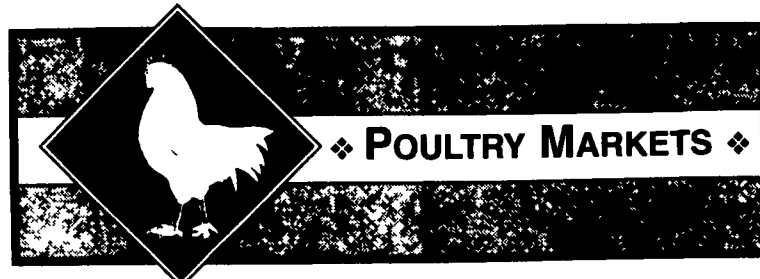

Prices were unchanged on sugar yolks, unchanged to slightly lower on salt yolk, irregular on whites and majority values were generally unchanged on whole when compared to a week earlier. Supplies were limited on sugar yolks balance of items were usually sufficient. Demand was in a full range of light to good. The undertone was steady on sugar yolks, cautious but steady on whole, and unsettled to barely steady on whites. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending April 21, 2001 were 8% more than the previous week, and 10% more than a year ago.
