Live supplies were moderate; weights were light to heavy, mostly desirable to heavy. Processing schedules were moderate to moderately heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 53 to 67 cents. Trade sentiment was mostly steady. In the parts complex, with the exception of wings which had increased in availability to a limited buying interest, supplies were generally noted as in good balance to closely cleared.
