Daily National Grain Market Summary

Wheat bids turned lower after two days of higher trends due to fund selling and profit taking on the Boards. Corn bids showed strength again as wet weather is seen as beneficial to already planted crops. Soybean bids received support from fund and commercial buying. Wheat 2 to 4 cents lower except Portland 4 cents higher. Corn steady to 2 cents higher. Sorghum 2 cents higher. Soybeans 1 to 7 cents higher.

Winter wheat harvest is underway in southern areas and yields look good. The poor conditions reported in some areas have limited declines but ideas are that it is not as bad as earlier thought. Profit taking set in across the Boards, pushing bids lower. Some areas have been ignored or abandoned but most places are seeing fair to good crop conditions. Overnight export sale to Jordan helped keep bids from falling too far.

Corn planting is well underway with Iowa reporting at least half their fields seeded. Planting, however, is significantly behind the average in that area. Rainy forecasts for much of the Midwest may slow planting progress many places but already seeded fields will benefit. Fund buying on the Board kept soybean bids climbing higher.
