## Farmers Union Joins Call To Dispel Estate Tax Myth

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Farmers Union officials recently joined Sens. Kent Conrad, D-N.D., and Byron Dorgan, D-N.D., to dispel the myth that repeal of the estate tax will help preserve family farms. While the call to preserve family farms has been the driving force behind the repeal attempt, the estate tax rarely applies to family farmers

and ranchers and is not the cause of the liquidation of farm and ranch operations.

"It is simply not true that family farms are being lost because of estate tax obligations," said Leland Swenson, president of the National Farmers Union. "This is a tax break for the extremely wealthy. If we spend this time providing tax breaks

for the ultra-wealthy in America, there will be nothing left to provide for good schools, hospitals and economic development in rural America and nothing with which to write a decent farm bill."

In reality, the estate tax applies to very few farms and ranches and has not caused the liquidation of farms as proponents suggest. Additionally, the estate tax repeal plan passed by the house, H.R. 8, would not eliminate the tax for another 10 years.
