Trucklot buying activity was moderate to fairly good as dealers acquired product for the holiday weekend. Offerings of boneless-skinless breasts were closely cleared, and bone-in breasts were no more than adequate to balanced.

Continued export demand kept dark meat lines clearing well. Wings were at least adequate for current needs. Movement through retail and distributive channels ranged moderate to fairly good as seasonal demand takes shape.

The market tone was fully steady to firm on breast items, steady to fully steady on dark meat cuts, about steady on wings.

Majority prices were unchanged on salt yolks, unchanged to slightly lower on whites, and unchanged to lower on whole and sugar yolks when compared to a week earlier. Supplies were limited on yolks, at least adequate on whole, and sufficient on white. Demand was irregular, with buyers cautious. The undertone

was mixed, with traders usually barely steady at prevailing values. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending April 28, 2001 were 4 % more than the previous week, but 8 % less than a year ago.

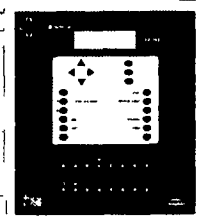

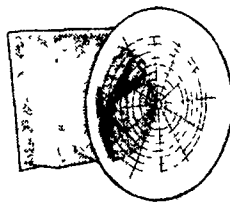

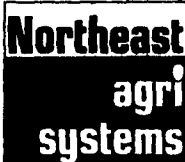

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds remained generally moderate. Seller offerings continued to vary in both size and volume with the 2.25 and 2.50 pound sizes in the closer balanced position at some points. 3.0 pound and heavier weights were in good balance to fully adequate. Live supplies were moderate; weights were light to heavy, mostly desirable to heavy. Processing schedules were moderately heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 53 to 67 cents. Trade sentiment was fully steady. In the parts complex, Breast items were in good balance to tight. Leg cuts were clearing satisfactorily. Wings were fully adequate.
