Food and refreshments will be available and a \$2 parking fee will be collected. Visitors are encouraged to bring chairs, blankets and their favorite instrument.


The C. Howard Hiester Canal Center and the Gruber Wagon Works will be open for tours on Sunday, from noon to 5
