CORN BELT FEEDSTUFFS: Wholesale Bids. Truck or Rail dollars per ton. Feedstuff prices were steady to mixed last week. Demand continued slow for

the most part. Some strength was due to tightness in some inventories. Pastures are greening up after the mild temperatures and beneficial rains the past couple of weeks. Farmers continue to plant corn and now drill beans.

SOYBEAN MEAL: 44 percent rail bids 2.00 lower to 4.00 higher at 150.50-156.50. 48 percent rail 1.00 lower to 3.00 higher at 160.50- 165.50. Truck 44 percent steady to 2.00 higher at 158.50-161.50; 48 percent steady to 4.00 higher at 164.50-169.50 per ton.

CORN BY-PRODUCTS: Gluten Feed 21 percent, Interior Points, steady at 45.00-58.00; Chicago steady to 2.00 higher at 45.00-58.00. 60 pct Gluten Meal, Interior points, steady at 220.00-240.00; Chicago steady at 220.00-240.00. Rail hominy feed Central Illinois Points, steady to 5.00 higher at 50.00; trucks steady to 3.00 higher at 50.00-52.00. Crude corn oil 25 points higher at 14.25-14.75 cents per lb.

Compared to last week: Feeder cattle steady to 2.00 lower, most declines on steers over 800 lbs and heifers over 700 lbs. Demand good for cattle that will

finish in the fall. Calves mostly new crops and these steady to 2.00 lower. Few thin calves firm. Demand moderate for fleshy new crops, good for thin calves. Quality plain to mostly average and improved from last several weeks. Feeder cattle in medium to moderate flesh and continue to show less flesh than what is normal for May wheat run. Weigh-ups average. Slaughter cows firm. Slaughter bulls steady. Packer demand good. Demand light for replacements and pairs as farmers are busy with hay and preparing for harvest. Cows and bulls totaled 780 head with 55 percent to packers. Receipts this week 14,800; last week 11,378; last year 13,361.

Supply consisted of 76 percent yearlings over 600 lbs; 19 percent calves and light yearlings under 600 lbs; 5 percent cows and bulls.

Heifers comprised 30 percent of feeder and calf supply.

Prices follow with weighted average weight and price in parenthesis.
