Prices usually ranged unchanged on yolks, irregular on whole and unchanged to lower on whites when compared to a week earlier. Supplies were limited on yolks, at least adequate on whole, and sufficient on white. Demand was light to moderate. The undertone was mixed but steadier on whites, about steady on whole and steady on yolks. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending May 12, 2001 were 4% more than the previous week, but 8% less than a year ago.
