tionalities. Pennsylvania Germans most often used quill rye for indoor baskets and oak for strong market baskets and outdoor usage.

Rye was another popular material used by Pennsylvania Germans. Being frugal, the early settlers raised rye from which they were able to derive bread flour, animal feed, and baskets from the leftover rye straw.

African Americans also left an imprint on basket making. Quill work woven into the baskets evolved from the Gullahs who came from Africa in the 1600s and settled off the coast of South Carolina to work in rice plantations. Winnowing baskets in large sizes to separate the chaff from the rice straw.

It is only in recent years that baskets have been made and used primarily for decorative purposes. Many of these are also highly collectible. But the rare finds of the past are often cherished heirlooms that will continue to reveal the history of basketry.

Even in third world countries exacting techniques are not seen as much as before. Fine details take so much time, and are not economically feastible. In addition there is the inability to obtain some materials. Because of a boom in building on coastal region, grasses are more difficult to find.


Like most antiques, the older the basket and better the quality the more demand and the higher the value.

"My advice to collectors is to buy the best value you can find, but make sure that it is a basket you like so that you enjoy it," Barrows said.
