National Direct slaughter steers: Live basis: Few, 65-80% Choice 75.00-79.75 weighted average price 76.99. Slaughter steers and heifers at Sioux Falls terminal market at steady prices. Sioux Falls mid-session: Steers: High Select to mostly Choice 2-3, 1265-1390 lbs 77.50-79.30. Select and Choice 2-3, 1095-1380 lbs 75.90-77.75. Part load Choice 2-3 Holsteins 1345 lbs 72.00. Select and Choice 2-3 Holsteins 1290-1515 lbs 65.00-68.00. Few Select 2-3 Holsteins 1250-1315 lbs 63.00-64.75. Heifers: High Select to mostly Choice 2-3, 1165-1280 lbs 77.50-78.85; Select and Choice 2-3 1060-1360 lbs 74.00-74.75. South St. Paul terminal slaughter steers and heifers steady. Cattle slaughter under federal inspection on Wednesday was estimated at 130,000 head compared to 132,000 a

week ago and 132,000 a year ago. Week to date totals through Wednesday 263,000 head compared to last week 395,000 and a year ago actual slaughtered 269,000.

Slaughter cows at South St. Paul were steady to 1.00 lower. Premium White 70-75% lean over 1200 lbs none. Breakers 70-80% lean over 1100 lbs 50.00-54.00. Boners 80-85% lean over 1050 lbs 48.00-52.00. Lean 85-90% lean over 850 lbs 43.00-46.00.

Barrows and gilts at terminal markets closed at steady prices on Wednesday, 48.50-52.00 on 220-270 lb 47-51% lean barrow and gilts. The National direct trade prices are based on 185 lbs hog carcass with 0.9-1.1 inch back fat and 6 inch square loin/2.0 inch depth plant delivered. National direct trade closed steady to firm prices ranging from 61.25-72.27 with average price of 67.42. Iowa-So. Minnesota direct trade was steady to 1.00 higher at 62.00-71.62 with an average price of 68.25. The Western Cornbelt closed steady to 0.75 higher at 61.25-72.27, average price 68.16. The Eastern Cornbelt trend closed generally steady with prices ranging 62.74-72.00, with an average price 66.21.

Hog slaughter under federal inspection on Wednesday was estimated at

374,000 head compared to 363,000 a week ago and 361,000 a year ago. Week to date totals through Wednesday 748,000 head compared to a week ago 1,072,000 head and a year ago actual slaughtered 724,000.

Slaughter lambs were generally steady in light test at So. St. Paul, MN. Sioux Falls sheep not adequately tested to establish a trend. So. St. Paul receipts totaled 250 head. Spring New Crop: Choice, end Prime 2-3 110-130 lbs 78.00-80.00; Fall Shorn and Old crop: Choice, end Prime 120-140 lbs with 1-2 pelts 75.00-78.00. The estimated lamb carcass cutout value was unavailable for Wednesday.

Sheep and lamb slaughter under federal inspection on Wednesday was estimated at 11,000 head compared to 9,000 a week ago and 13,000 a year ago. Week to date slaughter for sheep through Wednesday 22,000 head compared to a week ago 27,000 head and a year ago same day actual slaughtered 27,000 head.

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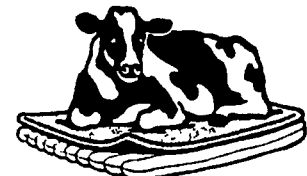
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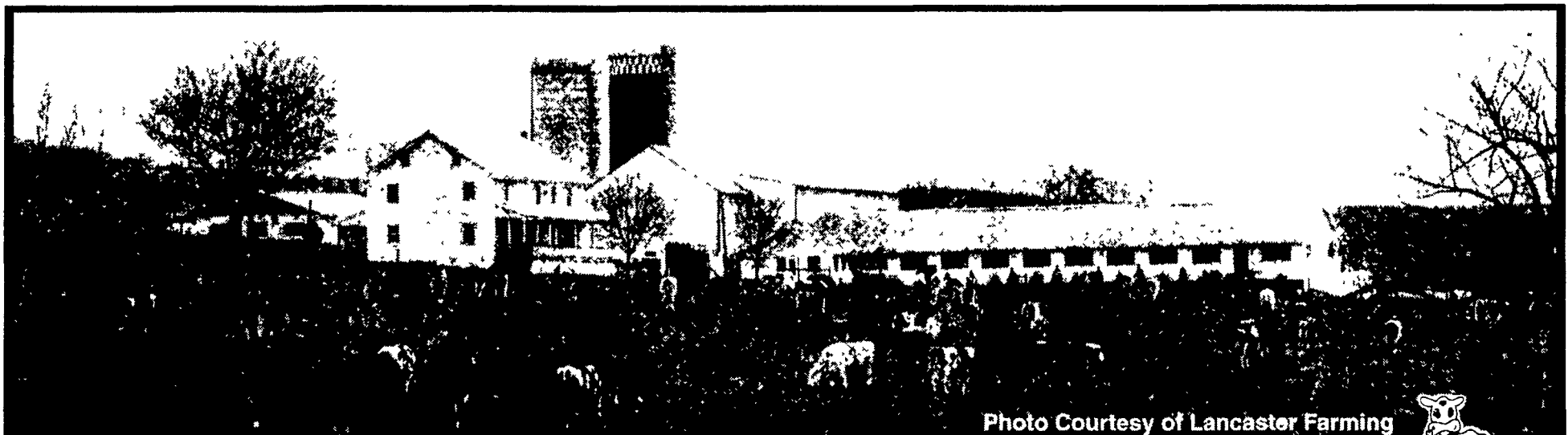


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
