FEEDER PIGS: Southern and Eastern U.S. Direct FOB Feeder Pig Report—Weekly summary of prices on a FOB farm basis, week ended May 25. Receipts this week 29,608; last week 42,110. Compared to last week, early weaned pigs steady; 40-50 pound feeder pigs steady to 2.00 per head lower. Demand light to moderate for moderate offerings. Receipts included 22,604 pigs shipped to Iowa and Central U.S.

Prices follow for 50-54% lean pigs by lot size, head count, prices per head with weighted average prices in parentheses.

EARLY WEANED PIGS, 10 lb BASIS: 250 or less: 505 head, 27.85-30.00 (28.94); 250-750: 2220 head, 25.35-30.00 (28.01); 750 or more: 7467 head, 27-32.50 (30.75). Total Composite: 10,192 head, 25.35-32.50 (30.06).

Prices do not include freight or broker fees. Many lots of 40-60 lb pigs sold with a .25-.40 per pound slide. Also, some lots of early weaned pigs have a 1.00 per pound sliding value adjusted from a 10 pound basis. Early wean pigs are under 19 days old.

Estimated lean value is projected to base slaughter weights with normal confinement feeding conditions.
