Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was light to fair and sufficient in keeping seller offerings of the 3.0 pound and lighter weights in good balance to well cleared. Heavier weights were fully adequate to ample. Live supplies were at least moderate; weights were light to heavy, often heavier than desired. Processing schedules were moderately heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 56 to 70 cents. Trade sentiment was mostly steady. In the parts complex, breast items, particularly boneless skinless were readily available and slow in clearing. Drums cleared well. Other leg cuts were adequate. Wings were ample.


