Favorable weather across the Midwest added pressure to bids. Some light export interest for wheat and corn was reported. Wheat mostly 1 cent lower except Portland 2 cents higher. Corn steady to 1 cent lower. Sorghum 1 cent

lower. Soybeans 1 to 3 cents higher.

Wheat bids were slightly lower as harvest progress continued. Good yields and quality have been reported most places. South Korea bought a mixture of wheat overnight. Good growing weather was also the weakening factor for corn. Soybean bids were slightly higher on carry-over strength from the recent Chinese purchase.

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


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
