Weekly summary of southern and eastern U.S. direct feeder pig prices on a FOB farm to farm basis for the week ended June 15. Receipts this week 44,293, last week 49,682. Compared to last week, early weaned pigs and 40-50 pound feeder pigs steady, 50 pounders 1.00 per head lower. Demand moderate for moderate offerings. Receipts included 31,504 pigs shipped to Iowa and Central U.S.

Prices follow for estimated 50-54% lean value pigs by lot size, head count, prices per head with weighted average prices in parentheses.

EARLY WEANED PIGS, 10 LBS. BASIS: 250 or less: 875 head, 29.14-35.83 (33.33); 250-750: 4220 head, 25.71-36.42 (29.90); 750 or more: 7200 head, 27-32.00 (30.19). Total Composite: 12, 12,295 head, 25.71-36.42 (30.32).
