Demand improved on whole with overall movement generally reported in a full range of light to good. Trade sentiment was steady, although traders continue to watch further market developments. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending June 16, 2001 were 2 % more than the previous week, but 13 % less than a year ago.


