Mostly prices were unchanged on sugar yolks and whites, unchanged to slightly higher on whole, but lower on salt yolks when compared to a week earlier. Supplies were usually adequate for current needs. Demand improved on whole with overall movement generally reported in a full range of light to good. Trade sentiment was steady, although traders continue to watch further market developments. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending June 16, 2001 were 2 % more than the previous week, but 13 % less than a year ago.

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds remained sufficient in keeping offerings in generally good balance. Buyers were noted as cautiously optimistic, but additional interest was usually limited to standing commitments. Live supplies were at least moderate; weights were light to heavy, mostly desirable to heavy. Processing schedules were moderate to moderately heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 56 to 70 cents. Trade sentiment was mostly steady. In the parts complex, breast cuts were adequate to tight and in the closer balance on supplies of bone-in. Leg items were adequate. Wings were readily available.

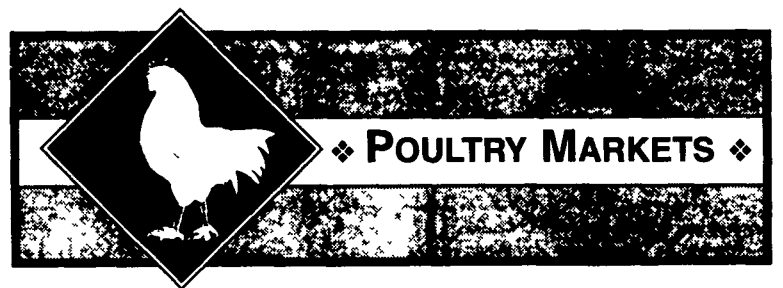
