Holsteins: Few, Choice 2-3 1345-1547 lbs 67.00-71.25. Heifers: No test.

Cattle slaughter under federal inspection through Tuesday was estimated at 129,000 head compared to 128,000 a week ago and 1,000 a year ago. Week to date 259,000 head compared to 256,000 a week ago and 125,000 a year ago.

Base price range 63.00-77.03 average price 70.56. The Eastern Cornbelt had no prices to report due to confidentiality.

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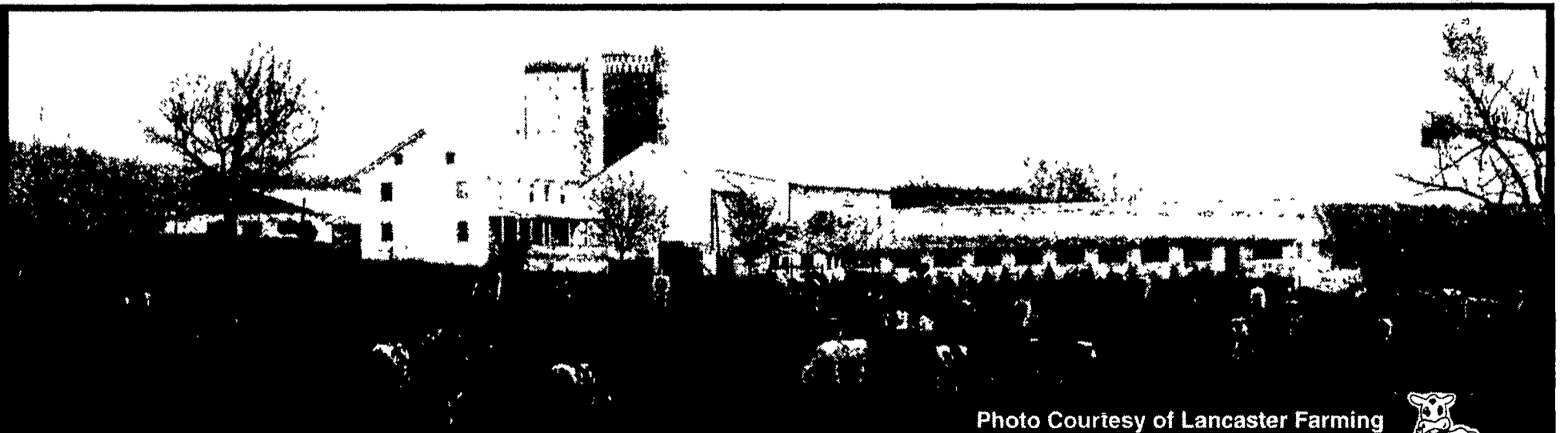



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
