with guns alone," he said, noting that nations have become subject to other nations because they lacked a viable agriculture.

"While agriculture remains our leading industry in the commonwealth, so much is changing," Hayes said. "Our progress from this point will determine how we transition agriculture in the new millenium. Understanding our past can help ease this transition to Pennsylvania's future."

To illustrate changes in agriculture in the last century, Hayes pointed out that two percent of our population is now farming to feed the other 98 percent — compared to 35 percent feeding the other 65 percent 100 years ago.

Partners in the new institute include the Landis Valley Associates ("friends" of the museum) and the Agricultural Coalition of Pennsylvania, a committee composed of agribusiness leaders in PennAg Industries Association.

Rep. Jere Strittmatter, (R-Lancaster), honorary director of the LVA and one of the developers of the institute, emphasized the importance of education as it relates to public policy.

"We need to do a better job of interrelating our educational and agricultural resources. Education is vital becasue the shaping of public policy relies on an informed citizenry," he said. "Agriculture is rapidly evolving

Calling the agricultural museum at Landis Valley "the best in the world," largely because of the preservation of surrounding farmland. Strittmatter said he looks forward to working with the new institute on scholarly findings related to "news-breaking topics affecting advanced agriculture and Pennsylvania."

According to Wenger, the first step of the institute will be to develop a steering committee comof posed agricultural representatives, the historical and educational communities, government, farmland interest, and other partners to establish the institute model.

"We will strive for sound, balanced, and effective educational projects that meet the criteria for accuracy and academic excellence," Wenger said.

Others present at the launch of the new project included state senator Noah Wenger, PHMC executive director Brent Glass, the Hans Herr chapter of the FFA, and farmland preservation representatives from various counties.

The Landis Valley Museum is a 100-acre, living history farm and agricultural facility, featuring original farmsteads dating to the early 1800s, historic breeds of plants and animals, and demonstrations of traditional skills such as basketmaking and tinsmithing.


