

Late Victorian Era Focused On Surface Decoration

From pattern glass to painted china and every object used in daily life, the emphasis in American design from 1870 to 1900 was decorative surfaces. Artists and craftsmen treated surfaces of china, wood, and silver as if they were a canvas.

were the bright nature themes from Japan. Colorful motifs included sunflowers, vines, birds, and seashells. It was quite a transition from the heavy, dark interiors of the mid-19th century. Although it is known as the "aesthetic movement" many of the design elements spilled over into the later arts and crafts movement. It has all been put to-

Among the many design influences of this eclectic period were Gothic, Greek Islamic, and Japanese. The latter being the most popular.

CLUES: Shapes became more angular, smoother, and less flamboyant. The once popular use of carvings and deep modeling was replaced with more linear and light decorations.

One of the most lasting and popular examples is American cut glass.

Interest began at the 1876 Centennial Exposition where several American glass companies showed their new design concepts. Along with their displays of clear and colored glass that was etched, cut engraved, molded, blown and pressed, was "rich-cut glass" known today as brilliantcut glass. At the time it was introduced the pieces were mainly used for decorative purposes, not for daily use.

Hundreds of patterns were introduced from 1876 until it temporarily went out of fashion by the end of World War 1. In the late 1970s it was being eagerly sought and collected.

Today signed pieces by quality glassmakers in the most intricate patterns can sell for more than \$3.000.

Because trademarks were often

acid-etched into the glass they are hard to spot.

Over the years patterns and designs changed. Each of the designs had a name, not necessarily in keeping with the actual design. There are many books on cut-glass patterns showing patterns and names. Furniture de-

signed during this period often used marquetry. It was in a variety of materials from colored mother-of-pearl,

thin sheets of metal and other precious materials. Often elaborate marquetry motifs included floral and nature subjects.

Ebonized wood, (wood that has been blackened) usually of cherry showed off the marquetry designs. Gilding was also popular.

If you come across a chair with visible tack heads, they were often part of Modern Gothic design pieces. Other metal decora-

tions used bronze, silver and nickel treated to look like brass and cut into various shapes and motifs, applied to the surface with brads or tacks.

If an object at first glance appears to be Japanese, a closer look may prove it to be late Victorian with Japanese influence. Known as "Japonism", furniture, silver, and painted china adapted Japanese motifs. A good example are the dragons used frequently by Rookwood pottery painters.
